DRIVING DIRECTIONS

Take Interstate 41 to Exit 113 (WI 26/N) those driving from the north turn left or coming from the south turn right (east) onto Hwy N; drive approximately 3 miles to US Highway 45. Turn right on US 45 and drive south for about 1 mile. Turn left onto Fahrnwald Road for 0.5 miles until it ends at our entrance gate. Drive through our gate onto our sacred grounds
